2025 was a historic milestone for Stray Animal Project. Thanks to your generous support, we successfully operated on **10,000 dogs and cats**—including strays and pets from low-income families. This achievement didn't just meet our goals; it set a new record in Peru.

We are creating a real, lasting impact across coastal and Andean communities. However, with millions of animals still living on the streets, our work is far from over.

Our 2026 Goal: 15,000 spay and neuters. We plan to expand our reach to new regions where overpopulation is critical and veterinary services are virtually non-existent. Thank you for loving and protecting the animals of Peru!



LONG-TERM IMPACT

Million

dogs and cats spared from a life of suffering on the streets over the next 7 years.

Based on 7,952 females fixed in 2025. Projections follow SNAP's conservative model: 508 dogs and 4,948 cats prevented per female and her descendants over 7 years.

OUR METHOD FOR LASTING IMPACT

1

Targeted Action:

We identify **high-need areas** and conduct censuses to estimate the local animal population.



2

Strategic Partnerships:

We sign collaboration **agreements** with local veterinarians, residents, and authorities.

3

Consistency:

We hold ongoing spay and neuter campaigns at least **once a month**.



4

The 70% Goal:

We continue our efforts until we reach a **70% fixed animals** rate for all animals in the target area.

5

RESULTS:

A sustainable, **long-term reduction** in the stray animal population.



SPOTLIGHT: CANGALLO, AYACUCHO



A lack of spaying and neutering in Cangallo led to health risks, including parasites and childhood anemia.

WHERE IS IT LOCATED?

Cangallo is a rural district in Ayacucho, where 70% of its 5,500 residents live in poverty.

Approximately 500 dogs and 400 cats are estimated to be roaming the streets in three small local communities.



Volunteers conducted the first animal census while simultaneously providing education on responsible pet ownership to the community.

FIRST CENSUS FINDINGS

471 Households Surveyed

90%

96% Unfixed cats

Residents agreed to spay or neuter their pets following our educational outreach.

87% Unfixed dogs

THE BEGINNING OF THE CAMPAIGNS

Two veterinarians travel from Huamanga to Cangallo every weekend.

In addition to spay/neuters surgeries, we provide complementary treatments such as deworming and pre-surgical blood tests.

Thanks to this consistency, spay and neuter campaigns have been held every single weekend without fail since September 2025.

EXPANDING TO PACHACUTEC, VENTANILLA

Pachacutec is a vulnerable area in Callao where 45% of the population lives in poverty. We launched free and low-cost campaigns here on November 16, 2025.

A lack of sterilization leads to increased abandonment and animal cruelty. To address this, we launch free and low-cost campaigns for stray animals and low-income families.

- ✓ Launched on November 16, 2025.
- ✓ In addition to surgeries, we provide free medications and host workshops on responsible pet ownership.
- ✓ By the end of 2025, we successfully spay and neuter 126 animals in Pachacutec.
